Description

Oenothera fruticosa sometimes called Evening Primrose, is also known as Sundrops. It is a native to dry soil, open fields, and open woods. It performs best in full sun to light shade in light and sandy soil and has a vigorous and sprawling clumping habit. To prolong the flowering season, cut back foliage to basal crown mid-summer. Moths pollinate the flowers, particularly Sphinx moths. Other occasional visitors include the Ruby-Throated hummingbirds, honeybees and bumblebees. *Oenothera fruticosa* spreads slowly by underground rhizomes, but is nothing like the horribly weedy *Oenothera speciosa*.
